

- Hughie Edwards Statue & Seat (2002) Artwork in Kings Square, artist Andrew Kay.
- 3. **Chess Table and Chairs** Artwork in Kings Square, artist Coral Lowry.
- 4. **John Curtin** Artwork in Kings Square alongside the Town Hall building, artists Charles Smith and Joan Walsh Smith.
- 5. **Tom Edwards Memorial** (1919) Artwork in Kings Square, sculptor Pietro Giacomo Porcelli.
- Mall Ground Terrazzo (2000) Artworks in High Street Mall
- 7. Writers Walk Totems (2006) Series of artworks in High Street from Pakenham to Cliff Street, artist Bridget Norton.
- 8. **True Blue Gallery** 84–86 High Street, authentic Aboriginal art, limited edition photography, prints, kiln-fired art glass and Australian-made souvenirs.
- 9. **Adam Monk Gallery** 62 High Street, collection of panoramic landscape photography by Adam Monk
- 10. **Creative Native Aboriginal Art** 71-73 High Street, authentic aboriginal art, crafts & didgeridoos.
- Jarrahcorp Furniture and Fine Art 57–59 High Street, specialising in Australian made furniture, woodcraft and fine art.
- 12. **Japingka Gallery** 47 High Street, fine indigenous art gallery with a full exhibition program.
- 13. **Port Jarrah Furniture** 45 High Street, original custom made jarrah, marri and sheoak furniture.
- 14. Moores Building Contemporary Art Gallery 46 Henry Street, a beautifully restored warehouse that is now an access gallery for emerging artists.
- C.Y. O'connor (1911) Artwork at the entrance to the harbour, outside the Port Authority Building, sculptor Pietro Giacomo Porcelli.
- Southern Crossings (2002) Artwork located at the south western side of the E Shed Markets, sculptor Tony Jones.
- E Shed Markets E Shed Victoria Quay, art and craft stalls
- 18. **Welcome Walls** At the entry to the Maritime Museum. A beautiful tribute to the significant contributions migrants have made to Western Australia.
- 19. **Maritime Museum** Victoria Quay, a breathtaking museum in the working port of Fremantle with art gallery, lecture theatre and submarine.
- 20. **Carter Studios** Unique gallery and studio space of Fremantle-based Artist Andrew Carter, located at the Round House
- 21. **J Shed Ceramic Art Studio** Unit 3 J Shed Fleet Street, modern ceramics, masterclasses, resident artist and visiting overseas artists.

- 22. **Greg James Sculpture Studio Gallery** Unit 2 J Shed Fleet Street, fine art gallery and loft overlooking working studio.
- 23. Fremantle School Of Fine Furniture Unit I J Shed Fleet Street, public access workshops, classes working with Western Australia timber.
- 24. **Kidogo Arthouse** Bathers Beach, gallery and art school offering accredited and short courses.
- 25. **Monument to the Old Jetty** (c1985) Artwork at Bathers Beach by artist Joan Campbell.
- 26. **Shipwreck Gallery** Cliff Street, features displays on early exploration and shipwrecks.
- 27. **The Jetty, Fishermen's Monument** (2003) Artwork over the water at Fishing Boat Harbour, designed by Jon Tarry and Greg James.
- 28. **Vasco De Gama Memorial** (1997) Artwork at the Western End of the Esplanade Park. John Kirkness designed the work, Edgar Nailor was the Ceramist, and Clare Bailey the Sculptor.
- 29. **Bon Scott Memorial** (2008) Tribute to a rock legend. Artwork directly outside Cicerello's, sculptor Greg James.
- 30. **Maitland Brown Memorial** (1913) Artwork on the Esplanade Park, sculptor Pietro Giacomo Porcelli.
- 31. Fremantle Markets Cnr Henderson Street and South Terrace, the nostalgia of yesteryear intermingled with the excitement and fun of fabulous Fremantle...paintings, photographs, original clothing, ceramics, hand-made paper, mosaics, leatherworks, craft-works, fresh food and surprises.
- 32. What It's Like To Be Me Furniture Artwork on South Terrace at the entrance to Fremantle Malls, artist Coral Lowry. Groups of young children contributed to the concept, design, construction and installation.
- John Gerovich (2006) Artwork at the intersection of William St & Parry St outside the Fremantle Oval, sculptor Robert Hitchcock.

The Fremantle Arts Centre – in Finnerty Street is just off the trail to the north east and is well worth the walk. A leading Western Australian arts venue with exhibitions, courses and workshops, free courtyard music, gift shop, café and museum.
