




Discovery Trail







- 1. **Fremantle Railway Station** –The first rail line from Perth opened in 1881.The station building was built in 1907 and the precinct is now the hub of Fremantle's public transport system.
- 2. **Pioneer Reserve** Historic parkland used for many civic purposes since the early 1900's.
- Spare Parts Puppet Theatre Developed as a commercial building in 1905, vested in the City of Fremantle in 1975 and converted to the Spare Parts Puppet theatre in 1985.
- Ernest & Peter Taylor Memorial Commemorating two young English migrants who died in Western Australia in 1905.
- 5. **High Street Mall** Converted into a pedestrian mall in the 1990s and the centre of Fremantle's shopping precinct.
- 6. **Cappuccino Strip** Renowned for its coffee houses and small restaurants.
- 7. **Fremantle Markets** Fremantle's famous public market, built on the north-west corner of the former Imperial Convict Establishment. The markets capture the atmosphere of the Victorian era.
- 8. **Esplanade Hotel** Fremantle's prime 4 star hotel built in a colonial architectural style.
- 9. **The Esplanade** The City's major parkland which is the venue for many annual events and festivals.
- Panter, Harding & Goldwyer Monument/Maitland Brown Plaque – A monument that now marks both sides of a tragic event.
- Notre Dame University A wonderful opportunity to see first-hand how some of the West End's most historic buildings have been recycled and to hear the story of Australia's only private Catholic university.
- 12. **Maritime Museum Shipwreck Gallery** The Maritime Museum houses the finest maritime archaeological collection in Australia.
- 13. Fremantle Fishing Boat Harbour The location of much of Fremantle's America's Cup activity now features a variety of cafés and restaurants. A memorial in honour of those who established the Western Australian fishing industry was unveiled at the harbour in 2004.
- 14. **Kidogo Arthouse** A former kerosene store, now the Kidogo Arthouse, an independent art centre offering custom designed fully equipped "art-holidays" for visitors to Fremantle.
- 15. **Bathers Beach** The site where Captain Charles Howe Fremantle landed in 1829 and proclaimed the land as British territory. Is also a good place to swim!
- Round House The Swan River Colony's first civil gaol. The Round House is WA's oldest remaining building. Tours of the Round House are available.

- 17. Whalers Tunnel & Cliffs The Whalers Tunnel was built by the Fremantle Whaling Company in 1837 to provide whalers with access to the town from the jetty and Bathers Beach.
- Barwil House Formally Dalgety and Company Bond Store, the building was erected in 1902 for the merchants and shipping agents Dalgety & Co. The building was recycled and converted into apartments in 1997.
- 19. Fremantle Ports Building Built in 1963, this building is Fremantle Ports' administration head office.
- 20. **C.Y. O'Connor Statue** This bronze sculpture pays tribute to its namesake, a brilliant engineer and one time Fremantle resident who designed the Mundaring to Goldfields water pipeline as well as the Fremantle Harbour.
- 21. WA Maritime Museum The museum features America's Cup winning yacht Australia II and fascinating stories of WA's maritime history.
- 22. **Submarine Ovens** The Oberon class submarine ovens is a Maritime Museum exhibit which serves as a living memorial to submariners and those who gave their lives while serving from Fremantle during WWII.
- 23. Leeuwin Ocean Adventure Foundation Home base and administration centre of sail training ship Leeuwin.
- 24. **Fremantle Harbour** Western Australia's main shipping port is one of the five major general cargo ports in Australia.
- E Shed E Shed was moved from its original harbourside location in 1996, and was recycled for use as the E Shed Markets.
- O'Connor Landing Is the Rottnest Island Ferry and Swan River Ferry Terminal - Fremantle's passenger ferry terminal.
- 27. **The Old Police Station, Victoria Quay** Originally (1912) an Immigration and Information Bureau this heritage building has served many uses over the years.
